Each therapist has their own large office and therapy room suite and we provide all the toys and materials needed for your therapy sessions. Therapists have the flexibility of working remotely part-time and the clinical team meets weekly via Zoom to collaborate together. No travel is required to client homes. Therapy sessions are 1-hour long and you manage your own schedule.

We also service the entire state through our established teletherapy model, founded in 2012. Depending on their situation, clients have the option of doing either Teletherapy or in-person sessions. Key Responsibilities

- Provide diagnostic auditory-verbal therapy to children with hearing loss for birth to school aged children and their families
- Educate and counsel clients and families on their treatment plans and progress
- Develop individualized therapy lesson plans for clients
- Conduct formal and informal evaluations of clients
- Provide referrals for other services needed when necessary

- Communicate regularly with members of the client care team, the client, family members, and other providers involved with the client's care

Skills

- Experience working with deaf or hard of hearing children (either through coursework or hands-on, hands-on preferred)
- Client evaluation using standardized assessments
- Client management
- Documentation of evaluations and therapy appointments
- Team approach – collaboration with AV team, audiologists, early interventionalists, and educators
- Knowledge of typical child development from birth to 6 years of age
- Ability to work independently with commitment to the vision, mission, and philosophy of the organization
- Experience in teletherapy is a plus
- Bilingual in Spanish and English is a plus

Qualifications

- Certified in Auditory-Verbal Therapy preferred but training and mentoring will be provided toward certification if necessary
- CCCs credentialing, with support provided towards obtaining your CCCs for CF applicants
- Eligible for a GA state SLP license, if not already obtained
- Will consider CF with strong training in Auditory-Verbal Therapy
